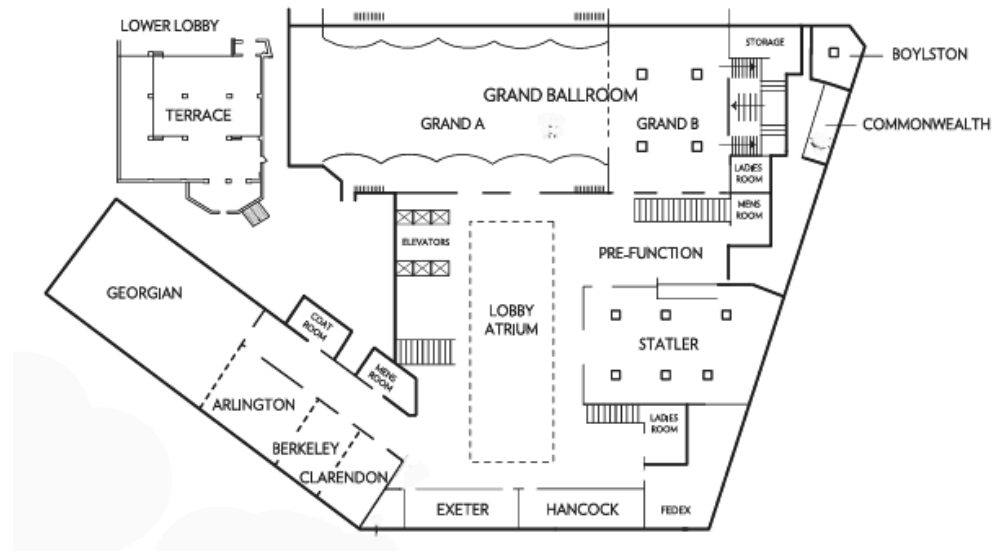
Lobby (first floor)



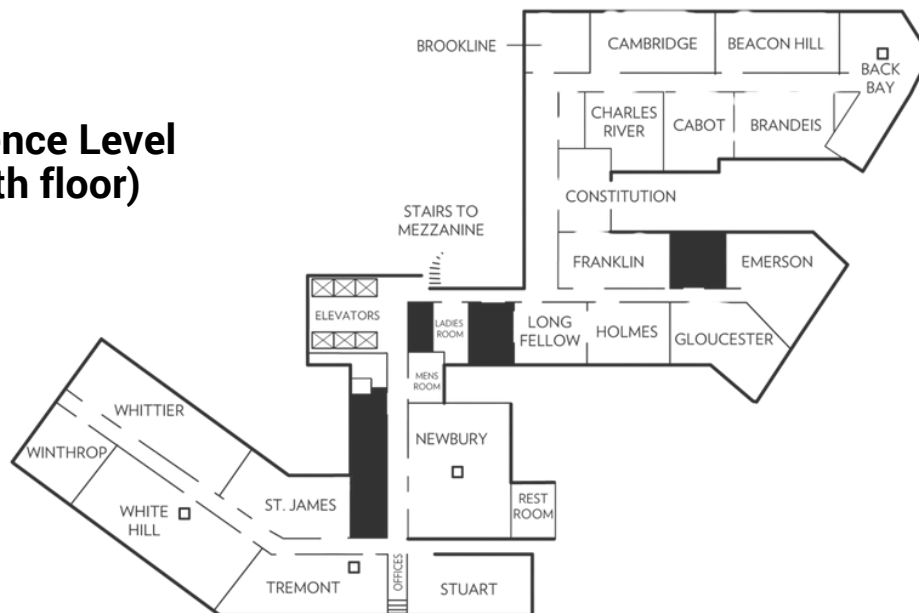
