Called to Lead: Empowering Spiritual Leadership in Hispanic/Latino Catholic Education

Hispanic/Latino communities are a vibrant and growing presence in Catholic schools across the United States. This workshop explores the unique vocation of spiritual leadership within the context of teacher, administrator or pastoral minister. Participants will reflect on their personal call to lead with faith, examine cultural and pastoral strategies to engage Hispanic/Latino families and explore models of spiritual leadership rooted in scripture, Catholic social teaching and the witness of Latino saints. Practical tools and strategies will be shared to help foster inclusive, faith-filled school environments that nurture both academic excellence and cultural belonging.

Charism is the Cure: Reclaiming Catholic Identity to Renew and Revitalize Our Schools

As Catholic schools face identity loss and the threat of closure, spiritual leadership rooted in charism offers a transformative path forward. This session presents a bold yet proven solution: return to your roots. Many schools have drifted from the charism of their founding orders or lost sight of their Catholic identity. Through a real-life case study-St. John Notre Dame School's five-year journey toward reaffiliation with the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur-participants will explore how to rediscover their founding story, engage staff and families in formation and bring Catholic identity to life in daily culture. Grounded in Dr. Timothy Cook's research on charism and culture and informed by guest lectures at LMU's Catholic School Leadership Academy, this session offers practical tools for restoring identity, faith and vitality.

Hiring for Mission: Building Teams that Evangelize, Educate, and Endure

Hiring for mission is critical to building schools that evangelize, educate, and endure. This session will equip principals and presidents with current, practical, and innovative strategies to recruit, interview, and retain staff who are committed to the mission. Participants will explore essential competencies for mission-fit candidates, collaborate on creating mission-centered interview practices and develop an actionable hiring plan. Learn how hiring intentionally strengthens both spiritual and strategic leadership and secures the future of Catholic education.

NSBECS DOMAIN: GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP

How to Work In Partnership with Difficult or Challenging Parents

This session gives principals a fresh, new toolbox for handling a difficult or challenging parent with compassion, confidence, and grace. Takeaways include: the five (5) types of challenging parents; why some parents bully the school and how to turn their frustration into trust; tips for documentation and follow-up that makes everyone feel heard and respected; how to avoid the typical mistakes many administrators make when dealing with an angry parent; how to handle "not my child" denial; what to do when a parent blindsides a teacher; expectation management—what it is and why it's vital; navigating parent cliques and social media drama; scripted verbiage, email templates, and other time savers.

This session will show participants how to transform a tense situation with a parent into an opportunity to build a productive, rewarding partnership that enriches the school, the student, and the parish.

Leading Evangelizing Communities: How Principals Can Use the New USCCB Religious Education Goals to Partner with Parents and Faculty in Forming Student Faith

Last year, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Subcommittee on the Catechism formally approved the new Handbook on the Catechetical Accompaniment Process. This document, which replaces the former USCCB Conformity Protocol for religious education curricula, outlines goals for religious education programs in both Catholic schools and parishes. This session will describe the movement from purely contentoriented objectives to goals that span three domains: Cognitive (concepts to be learned), Interior Life (attitudes and dispositions to be fostered), and Behavioral (action steps to living and sharing the faith—at home, at school and in the larger community). Come and learn about this new blueprint for building and growing a cohesive and robust Catholic identity in your school.

Supporting Teachers for Faith Integration

One key element of a robust Catholic identity for our schools is having the faith well integrated across the curriculum. Very few of our teachers, however, have received any formal training for this task. The good news is that their good questions have good answers. And when their questions are taken seriously, sometimes even your biggest skeptic can become a leader.

Let's dive into data-driven instruction! As demonstrated in recent National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) scores, Catholic schools have continued to experience growth and achievement. Students, especially in today's Catholic school classrooms, have varied needs and interests. The challenge for Catholic school educators is first to identify those areas of need and strength, but then to have the resources and tools to address those areas in a way that honors each student's background and interests. In this collaborative session, we will look at assessment strategies, as well as reports and resources that incorporate Universal Design for Learning (UDL) principles. We will also discuss the practical aspects of finding time within the learning environment to reach and engage every learner. We will focus on strategies that transcend platforms and programs.

Empowering Every Learner: Building a Sustainable MTSS Framework in Catholic Schools

How can school leaders ensure that every studentregardless of academic, behavioral or social-emotional needs-receives the support necessary to thrive? At St. Austin Catholic School in Austin, TX, a strong Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) has been cultivated over 15 years to do just that. Rooted in the mission of forming the whole child, the model integrates data-driven practices, differentiated instruction and strategic scheduling within a faith-filled environment. Through early identification using universal screeners, educators provide timely, targeted support. Teachers use Universal Design for Learning (UDL) to ensure access for all learners. A collaborative faculty culture, supported by professional development and outside specialists, strengthens the system. This session provides leaders with practical strategies to build sustainable, missiondriven MTSS frameworks.

Supercharging Tier 1 Instruction: Strategies to Get More Growth from All Students, in All Subjects, at All Levels

You've probably heard the saying, "You can't intervene your way out of a Tier 1 problem." This is certainly true given that strong core instruction is the foundation of any effective MTSS implementation. Yet, few schools meet the age-old rule-of-thumb of 80 percent of students progressing appropriately solely with Tier 1 services. There's a proven way to radically improve both student performance and motivation that goes overlooked by too many schools. It has been proven effective with students of all ages and across all subjects repeatedly worldwide and it's even highly cost-effective. This session will focus on research-based strategies to supercharge daily instruction that can be implemented at any grade level and in any content area.

The Heart of the Matter: Inclusionary Approaches in Catholic Schools

So much of the work on educating students with disabilities is focused on resources (or the lack thereof). Yes, resources are critical, but this focus may be missing the mark. The education of the student with a disability is not only about that student, but it is about the other students in the class and the ability to help them grow in understanding the life and dignity of the human person. This session will focus on the process of mapping the journey to build capacity to educate students with disabilities. A critical element of this presentation will be on building the knowledge and skills and the foundational spiritual elements that are requisite for the entire school community.

Creating a Written Strategic Plan for Development/Advancement

Building on content from the new NCEA book (June 2025), "The Cadence of Catholic School Development," this presentation will show attendees how to create their own written plan for development/advancement. This plan will be built around the six major components of development: 1. Constituent Records; 2. Communications; 3. Enrollment Management; 4. Fund Development; 5. Alum Involvement; 6. Fund/Friend-Raising Events. A prototype will be provided where school leaders will be able to identify their challenges, create strategic solutions, understand best practices and establish the metrics to make sure the plan stays on track.

Mission-Driven Growth: Aligning Enrollment Strategy with Financial Stewardship

Sustainable Catholic school leadership requires a unified approach to enrollment and budgeting. Explore tools to track key data, anticipate demographic trends, and engage stakeholders in mission-driven decision-making that ensures long-term viability and faith-filled growth.

However, when embraced as an opportunity for reflection and growth, accreditation becomes a powerful tool to shape a school's future. This presentation will help leaders rethink accreditation as more than a compliance exercise, positioning it as a key part of their strategic leadership. The session will show how the process reveals strengths and areas for improvement and can guide planning to meet evolving community needs. Strategic leaders must move beyond reporting to engage deeply with accreditation data. When integrated into the planning cycle, accreditation drives sustainability, enhances student outcomes, and builds ownership among faculty, staff, students, and parents.

Understanding the Consultation Process and the Rights of Private Schools Under the Federal ESSA Legislation

Trying to understand the hundreds of pages of federal guidance, completing endless paperwork required for participation, being told this is all you get without understanding why, and asking yourself is it worth all the headache can make the Title program experience overwhelming.

Building and sustaining an effective board is critical to the strategic success of any school. Yet many leaders are uncertain about how to assess their board's structure or where to begin building and strengthening it. This session offers a roadmap, equipping leaders to identify their type of board, understand the critical role of bylaws, and apply practical tools like board matrices, committee charters, meeting agendas, and cycle-of-meetings templates to launch and sustain a high-functioning board. Participants will engage with interactive polling, video insights, and discussion opportunities to allow participants to apply learning to their own settings. Leaders will leave with concrete resources and actionable next steps for starting, or restarting, a better board grounded in mission and best practices.

Utilizing School Choice Scholarship Programs in Admissions Strategies to Maximize Enrollment

This session will focus on how building-level school leaders can assess, plan, and adjust admissions and enrollment strategies to raise interest among families and spur enrollment in their schools using school choice scholarships.
