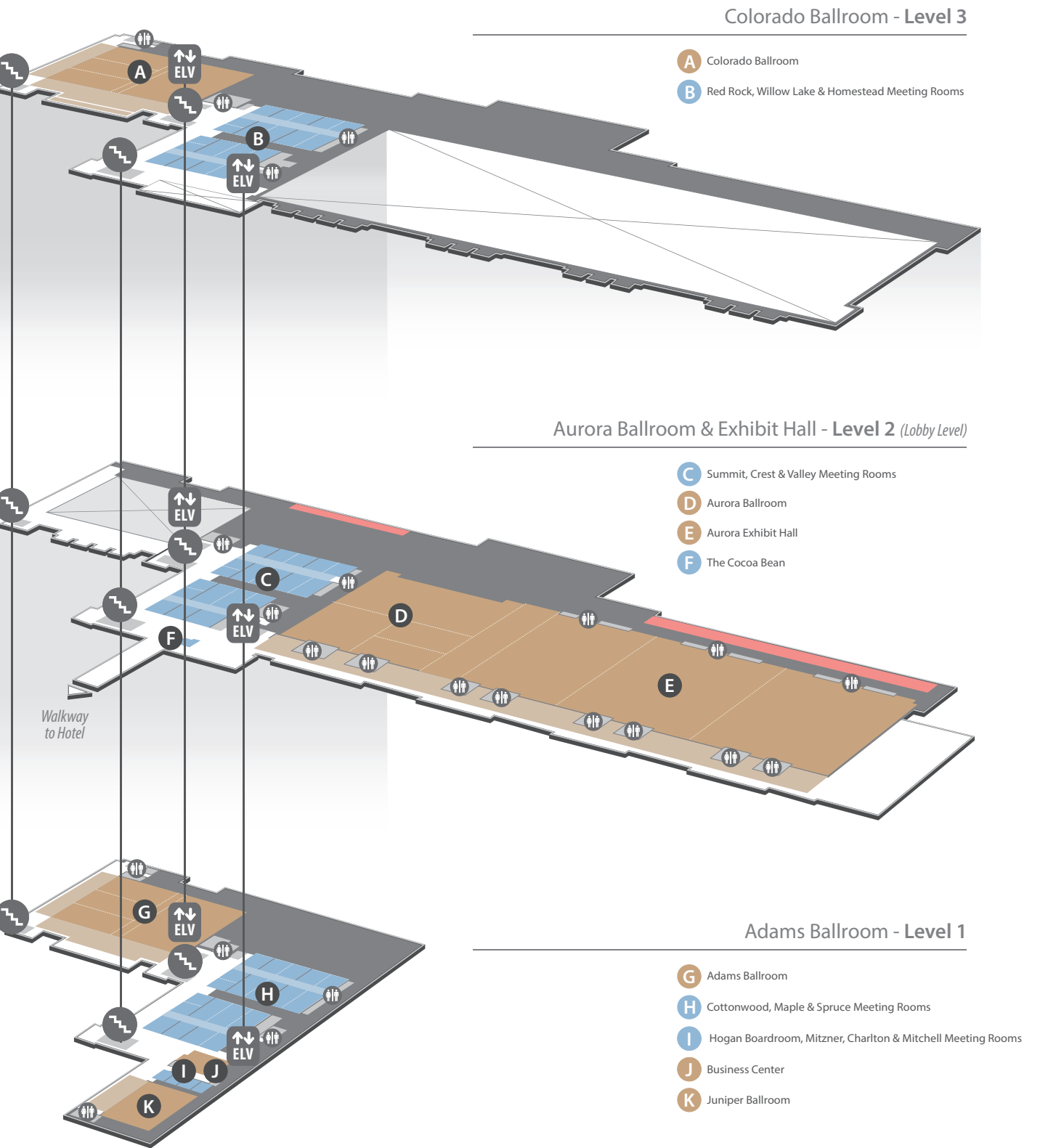

BUPRENORPHINE AND BEYOND: MANAGEMENT OF PERINATAL SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

This course, designed for maternal-fetal medicine professionals, focuses on managing perinatal substance use disorders (SUD) with evidence-based and evidence-informed strategies for pregnancy and postpartum care. It covers perinatal opioid use disorder (OUD) management, including screening techniques, medication protocols, and optimizing peripartum pain management. Additionally, the course fulfills 7 of the 8 hours required by the DEA for education on substance use disorders, supporting healthcare providers in meeting licensing requirements.

Learning Objectives:

1. Initiate and manage medication for opioid use disorder (MOUD) surrounding pregnancy as well as identify and manage the initial treatment of perinatal substance use disorders (SUDs), including more complex clinical cases.
2. Outline successful tools for development of standardized SUD screening, referral and treatment in MFM practice.
3. Interpret principles of motivational interviewing for developing a skill set for effectively delivering brief interventions targeting substance use behaviors in clinical practice.
4. Develop local and institutional protocols and care guidelines for peripartum pain management for pregnant and parenting people with SUD.

FIRST-TRIMESTER ANATOMIC IMAGING: A CRITICAL TIME TO EVALUATE THE PREGNANCY

Course Chairs: Bryann Bromley, MD; Marti D. Soffer, MD, MPH

This course brings together maternal-fetal medicine specialists to enhance their skills in first-trimester fetal and placental sonographic evaluations. It covers national and international guidelines, detailed lectures on organ systems, anomaly identification, and strategies for improving image quality. Topics include anomaly progression, artifacts, diagnostic genetic assessments, and the performance metrics of early anatomical ultrasounds, highlighting false-positives and false-negatives. The course also addresses health disparities, implementation barriers, and patient autonomy in reproductive decisions, emphasizing the importance of early ultrasound examinations.

Learning Objectives:

1. Recognize the differences between standard and detailed early anatomic imaging protocols, both nationally and internationally, and appreciate the importance of adhering to them.
2. Demonstrate the ability to utilize ultrasound systems to optimize image quality including 2D, 3D, and color/power directional Doppler.
3. Identify and discuss structural anomalies that are “almost always or potentially detected” between 12 0d-13 6d weeks, while recognizing which anomalies are not detectable in this gestational age period.
4. Provide examples of evidence-based genetic testing triggered by ultrasound findings detected in the first trimester including an isolated enlarged nuchal translucency and structural anomalies.
5. Recognize the performance metrics of early anatomic imaging as a screening tool for structural malformations in the era of cell-free DNA screening.
6. Be mindful of the placenta and adnexa, understanding the specific observations at this gestational age.
7. Describe patient perspective and autonomy for reproductive choices.
8. Examine obstacles including the execution and fair distribution of resources to pregnant people.

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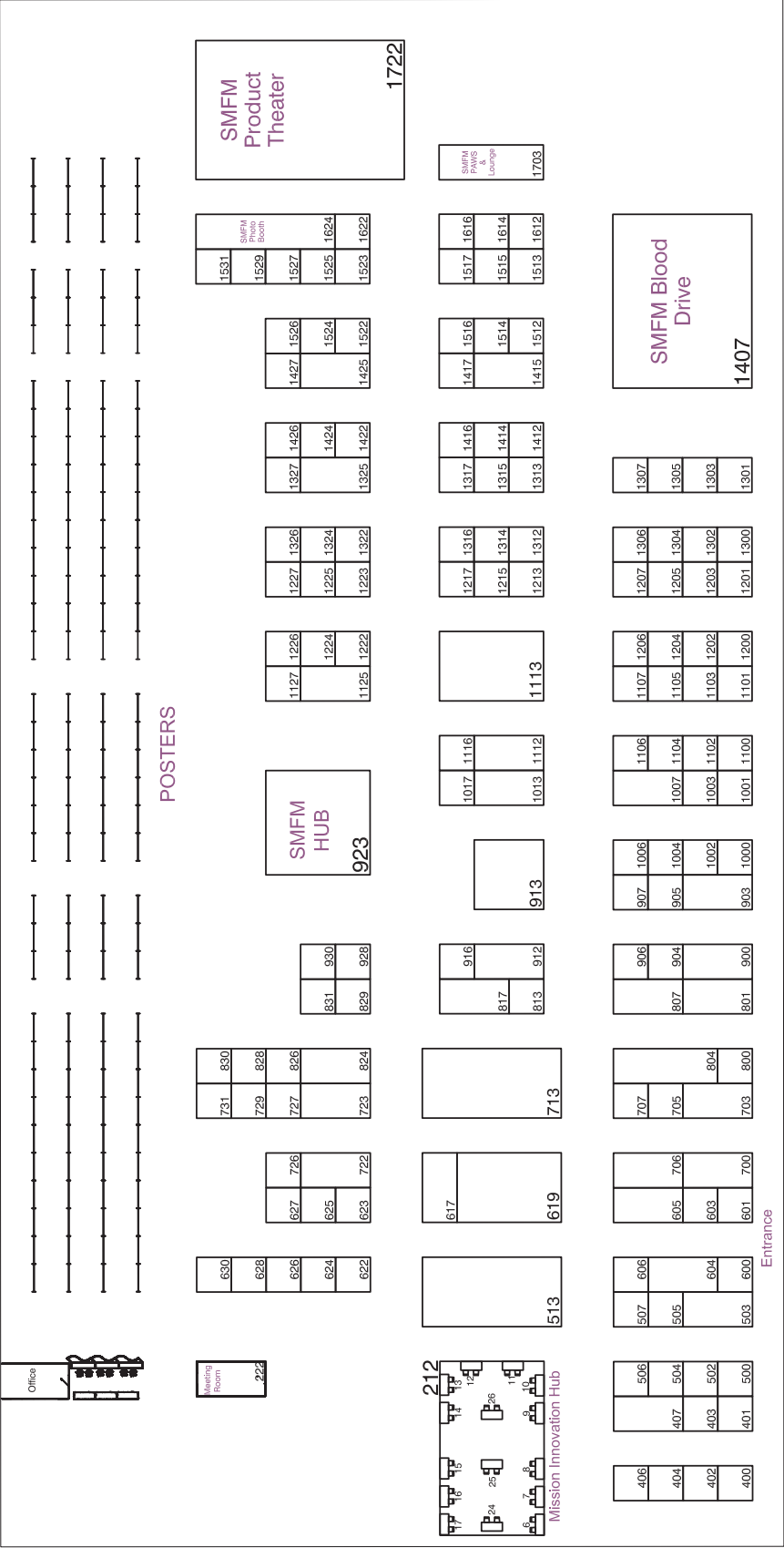
